EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

This course develops students' academic communication skills and critical thinking in English, with a particular focus on speaking. Students will study topics of interest, research and create a presentation, listen to and evaluate a lecture, and participate in an evidence-based seminar discussion. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS and SEMINAR ACTIVATION

The seminar is offered in the first and second semester to students of the MA programmes in: Global and Local Studies (GLOCAL); Organization, Society and Technology Studies (OST); and Methodology, Organization and Evaluation of Social Services (MOVASS), and includes 36 hours of lessons.

The course will only be activated if there is a sufficient number of students (minimum 10). Additionally, the second group will only be activated if the first one reaches 30 enrolments.

In order to enrol in the course, students need to have a B2 level of English (Common European Framework of Reference) which may be attested in one of the following ways:

- Taking the CLA [placement test](https://www.cla.unitn.it/en/540/placement-test) and achieving C1a level* (<https://www.cla.unitn.it/en/540/placement-test>);
- Passing a B2b level course at CLA (valid for one year from the date of course completion);
- Passing the CLA B2 exam;
- Presenting a B2 level certificate - see the list of recognised certificates at <https://corsi.unitn.it/it/global-and-local-studies/studiare/competenze-linguistiche> or <https://corsi.unitn.it/it/organizzazione-societa-e-tecnologia/studiare/competenze-linguistiche> or <https://corsi.unitn.it/it/metodologia-organizzazione-e-valutazione-dei-servizi-sociali/studiare/competenze-linguistiche>

At the first lecture, students must present certification or proof of having taken the online test with an adequate result. Once the course begins, the teacher may decide to exclude any student who does not meet language expectations from the seminar (offering them advice on how to fill the gaps), even if the student has suitable certifications.

*Those who, between the previous two months and two weeks before the course, have already taken the CLA placement test with an inadequate level may request a retake by writing to seminaricredito.srs@unitn.it and indicating date taken and level achieved.

PASSING THE SEMINAR

The minimum hours in attendance cannot be less than 27 hours; for the remaining 9 hours the teacher will be able to provide material and support for non-attending students in the forms deemed most appropriate. Assessments take place on an ongoing basis and passing all activities will allow for the acquisition of 3 training credits.

NUMBER OF RECOGNISED CREDITS

The final number of recognised credits depends on the curriculum of the relevant degree programme and may vary if the student already has other English language skills in their curriculum.
