Societies' aging populations provide challenges for national economics, welfare systems and families in all advanced societies. What are the drivers behind ageing population, what the consequences? How can societies successfully deal with the connected challenges and how can welfare systems help single families as well as national economies to face them?

In this seminar we look at demographic change in a European comparative perspective and touch on some of its drivers. The focus, though, lies on the possible consequences of aging, at the societal and individual level, and the ways to intervene, not least to cushion some of the potentially adverse consequences. We bring together different disciplines to take a fresh and careful look at cross-national diversities, recent changes and its impacts in comparative perspective.

Topics cover the demographic and societal changes, the development of long-term care policies, discussing some of the most controversial issues involved.

The seminar is proposed, in first place, for MA students of the program in "Sociology and Social Research SSR" and "MOVASS", but is open also to other interested MA students.

It is organized in a series of 6 sessions for an overall of 12 hours. A reading list will be provided to participants in advance and its preparation is taken for granted. A continuous and active participation is expected, as well as the preparation of a short paper and its presentation, in order to obtain the credits.
